Larry Dale Boles, 73, of Columbus, died at 3:11p.m. March 11, 2020, at Columbus Regional Hospital.

Larry was born July 30, 1946, in Jamestown, Tennessee, the son of Daley Robert and Loma Louise Beatty Boles. He married Jeannie Crider June 9, 1967, spending 52 years of marriage together.

Larry served his country in the U. S. Navy during the Vietnam War. In 2008, he retired from Cummins working as a mechanical engineer. Larry had also worked part-time at Columbus Regional Hospital and Harden Trucking.

The funeral will be conducted at 1 p.m. Monday, March 16, 2020, at Jewell-Rittman Family Funeral Home with the Rev. Doran Chambers officiating. Calling will be 2 to 6 p.m. Sunday and one hour prior to the service Monday. Burial will be at Bethel Baptist Cemetery with military honors presented by the Bartholomew County Veterans Honor Guard.


